Dear Inlet Watch Members:

Just like clockwork, we find ourselves in the final days of another successful year for Inlet Watch Yacht Club. The past twelve months gave us another example of the incredibly diverse activity that occurs at our large marina facility. In fact, an astounding mark was reached in 2024: our highest count of IWYC members in its history! We're very proud of this achievement and believe that it provides a proper segue to topics that we'll be discussing in detail at our upcoming annual meeting. Three of those topics pertain to amendments we're asking our owners to vote on that relate to the smooth and efficient operation of our marina. A brief description of these amendments will be provided below.

Amendment #1 is to approve the adoption of Electronic Communication as an approved form of membership receipt.

Electronic communication is simply another name for email. This is an incredibly important housekeeping item for IWYC, as it will allow our members to choose email notifications instead of costly printed and mailed notifications. In addition, the passing of this amendment will eliminate the need for the request of the waiver of the printed and mailed annual meeting notice that occurs every year *Even if you desire to receive a printed and mailed notice, voting yes will allow for your fellow IWYC member to choose if the electronic communication option is right for him/her.* 

Amendment #2 concerns the proposed approval of meetings conducted via electronic means. This is another important housekeeping item for IWYC. Multiple forms of electronic meeting platforms commonplace after the onslaught of COVID-19 are now a practical part of our everyday lives. Popular meeting platforms such as Zoom and Microsoft Teams will not be going away anytime soon. Plus, the electronic meeting option has already brought an incredible benefit to the members of IWYC who do not live in Wilmington to attend such membership meetings. *This yes vote is to formally memorialize electronic meetings as an approved form of meeting for the benefit and increased meeting access of our members.* 

Amendment #3 deals with increasing the Special Assessment amount to meet current needs. This topic has been one that our membership has discussed previously and has remained on most members' minds for so very long. It is also a topic that most owners associations (and marina facilities) that have been around for multiple decades have addressed head on. As we're in the midst of completing needed, housekeeping amendments, we feel this is also a timely opportunity to adjust our \$100 Special Assessment limit so that our board of directors can assess up to more appropriate limits. While some of our members know that the \$100 limit was established in 1985, virtually all our members are aware that the buying power of \$100 in 2024 is absolutely not the same as it was in 1985. This unfortunately limits IWYC's ability to fund upkeep of the marina and we believe the most responsible course of action for the benefit of our slip owners and the multitude of members who have acquired access to IWYC through leased slips is to bring our Special Assessment into proper adjustment. On the enclosed Proxy/Ballot, two proposed options are available to increase the Special Assessment from the existing \$100 limit to either up to \$500 or up to \$2,000 - recommended by your Board of Directors.

This year, our annual meeting will be held in-person at the Winter Park Baptist Church Community Center (directions enclosed). An on-line virtual meeting option via Zoom will also be available for those members who cannot attend in-person. The 2025 Annual Meeting will take place on January 18, 2025 at 10 a.m. Further instructions and information about the planned virtual meeting will be made available to our membership as we near its scheduled date. 2025 dues increase of \$25/month per slip will help offset increased expenses such as insurance, maintenance and labor. We look forward to discussing each of the items mentioned above and more at our upcoming annual meeting. *As a final note, we encourage as many members as possible to conveniently complete a proxy/ballot electronically prior to the meeting. An invitation email to receive an electronic proxy/ballot will be sent to our members in the coming days prior to the annual meeting.* 

Thank you to all of our members, board of directors and staff for their continued striving to make Inlet Watch such a success! Have a safe and wonderful holiday season everyone!

#### Amendment #1: Adoption of Electronic Communication as an approved form of membership receipt

#### Existing excerpt from the By-Laws: Article VI: Notices, Section 1: Definition reads:

"Whenever under the provisions of the law, the Declaration, the Articles of Incorporation or these By-Laws, notice is required to be given to any Director or member, it shall not be construed to mean personal notice; but such notice may be given to such Director or member in writing by depositing the same in the post office or letter box in a postpaid, sealed envelope addressed as appears on the books of the corporation."

#### **Replace with the following:**

"...as appears on the books of the corporation, or by means of electronic communication via email to the registered email address of such Director or member for all matters of notice except those involving liens to the Director or member's fee simple undivided interest or concerning the potential revocation of the Director or member's Club Membership License Certificate. Notice of matters involving the aforementioned liens or revocation may only be given to such Director or member in writing by depositing the same in the post office or letter box in a postpaid, sealed envelope addressed as appears on the books of the corporation."

## Existing excerpt from the Declaration: Article IV: Covenants for Maintenance Assessments, Section 4: Special Assessments reads:

"... Except as specified herein all special assessments shall be determined, imposed, levied and collected in the manner prescribed in the By-Laws provided that, if such special assessment exceeds **\$100.00** in any fiscal year for any membership, such assessments shall have the approval of members, in person or by proxy, entitled to cast two-thirds (2/3) of the votes at a meeting duly called for this purpose, written notice of which shall be sent to all members not less than fifteen (15) days nor more than thirty (30) days in advance of the meeting setting forth the time, date, place and purpose of the meeting." (bold added)

#### **Replace with the following:**

"... Except as specified herein all special assessments shall be determined, imposed, levied and collected in the manner prescribed in the By-Laws provided that, if such special assessment exceeds \$2000.00 in any fiscal year for any membership, such assessments shall have the approval of members, in person or by proxy, entitled to cast two-thirds (2/3) of the votes at a meeting duly called for this purpose, written notice of which shall be sent to all members not less than fifteen (15) days nor more than thirty (30) days in advance of the meeting setting forth the time, date, place and purpose of the meeting."
